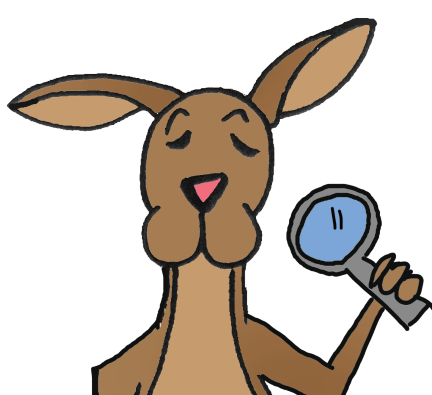

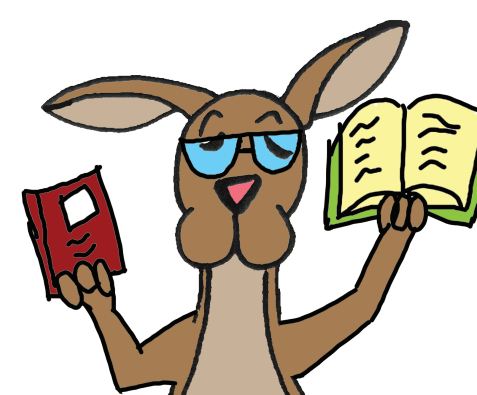


HIGHER ORDER SKILLS
